HPV Task Force - Update

The HPV Task Force is gearing up to apply for another mini grant. At the current time, we are soliciting ideas for the grant from task force members. We have set three main priorities for the year: 1) Unify HPV prevention work around the state of Colorado to ensure consistent messaging and a unified front, 2) Identify individuals for an HPV roundtable and determine the feasibility, 3) Identify needs for materials, education, etc. with regard to HPV vaccination throughout the state. We are constantly looking at ways to spread our message and recruit new task force members.

Lung Cancer Task Force Update

Subcommittees:

- 1. Environmental Scan on Lung Cancer Completed application with CIVHC for environmental scan. Received \$28464 scholarship funding from CIVHC and \$2000 grant from CCC to cover the cost (\$30646) of the environmental scan. Expect first presentation of data on or before Jan 31.
- 2. Education and Awareness of Lung Cancer Screening for public and providers Ongoing

Updates/Successes (correlated with Action Plan)

- 1. Goal 1: Reduce initiation and use of tobacco products: Although Amendment 72 did not pass, a group of dedicated stakeholders was identified. There is continued interest in another ballot initiative, encouraged by the success of a local tobacco tax increase in Aspen/Pitkin County November 2017.
- 2. Goal 4: Decrease environmental exposures that lead to cancer. Radon experts are members of the Lung Cancer Task Force and provide educational updates and resources to the Task Force members.
- 3. Goal 5: Increase high quality cancer screening and early detection rate:
 - a. Update/educate primary care providers on evidence based guidelines for lung cancer screening and the importance of early detection of lung cancer by Lung Cancer Screening CT:
 - i. Developed Social media toolkit for Lung Cancer Awareness month
 - ii. Developed slide set for use by physician champions to educate primary care providers.
 - iii. Provided education to Task Force members reviewed two articles in the medical literature about challenges and educational hurdles in Lung Cancer Screening
 - iv. Working with "Catch-it-in-time" organization to overcome barriers to screening by engaging and educating health care providers
 - v. Engaging COPIC to help with education of physicians and adoption of screening in Colorado.

- vi. Engaging the Colorado American Academy of Physicians to assess their position on lung cancer screening in hopes of increasing adoption by their primary care physicians.
- vii. Working with American Lung Association to utilize/adapt provider tools and resources
- b. Educate patients on the importance of early detection of Lung Cancer and the Lung Cancer Screening CT:
 - Working with "Catch-it-in-time" organization to create and distribute positive messaging surrounding lung cancer screening including branded and nonbranded educational materials/videos.
 - ii. Working with American Lung Association to utilize/adapt patient education tools and resources.
- c. Collaborate with health plans to achieve increased cancer screening compliance rates:
 - i. Obtaining baseline data through environmental scan
- 4. Goal 6 (Consistent access to, and application of, quality diagnostic and treatment services adherent with nationally recognized standards) and Goals 8,9,10 (Post-Treatment Survivorship and End-Life-Care): The Lung Cancer Task Force has recently welcomed new members from industry (Astrazeneca) and an oncologist Dr. Ed Arenson to help provide guidance and leadership with these efforts.
